The Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation (SCCF) has assembled a comprehensive bird species list for the islands of Sanibel and Captiva. The goal of this list is to be able to educate our community on the full breadth of birdlife that has made use of our islands—whether they are full-time resident species or just briefly stopping by during migration.

Species lists are a valuable tool for public outreach, as we aim to promote community and individual stewardship over our wildlife. This list will also prove valuable for science and conservation, as we continue to assess and monitor species richness and composition on our islands, knowing that it has become increasingly important to manage our landscapes for biodiversity.

We have formatted this list into a birdwatcher-friendly checklist format, so that island residents as well as visitors will be able to document the species they've seen as they birdwatch around the islands. This list can be used digitally or downloaded and printed. In both formats, users can continue to mark the species of birds they have observed. In the digital pdf format, users can click on the common names of bird species to be directed to Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology's [AllAboutBirds.org](https://www.allaboutbirds.org), a great resource for more information about that species, including multimedia, range maps, and tips for identification.
